

## **PREVIOUS COUNCIL DIRECTION**

On 2015 July 15, Council adopted CPS2015-0615 Sport Facility Renewal Funding Recommendations, approving Attachment 3, outlining recommended funding allocations for the 2015 Sport Facility Renewal Program, pending confirmation of project eligibility from Alberta Municipal Affairs; and directed Administration to prioritize 2016 Sport Facility Renewal Funding Program applications firstly in alignment with Council's original commitment (report C2008-86) to investment \$10 million per quadrant and secondly to pool all remaining funds and prioritize projects regardless of the quadrant of origin.

On 2013, Council adopted CPS2013-0411, Sport Facility Renewal Funding Recommendations, approving Attachment 1, outlining recommended funding allocations for the 2013 Sport Facility Renewal Program pending confirmation of project eligibility from Alberta Municipal Affairs.

On 2012 November 19, Council adopted PFC2012-0736, approving an additional \$2.3 million from the MSI Sport Facility Renewal Grant for the Calgary Soccer Federation Annex project into Recreation, Program 507.

On 2012 May 28, Council adopted CPS2012-25, approving recommended funding allocations for the 2012 Sport Facility Renewal program, pending confirmation of project eligibility from Alberta Municipal Affairs.

On 2011 May 16, Council adopted CPS2011-27, approving recommended funding allocations for the 2011 Sport Facility Renewal program, pending confirmation of project eligibility from Alberta Municipal Affairs.

On 2008 December 15, Council approved C2008-86, the Municipal Sustainability Initiative (MSI) Program Guidelines and Criteria for Recreation Projects.

On 2008 November 03, Council approved in principle CPS2008-84, the Implementation Plan for the 10 Year Strategic Plan for Sport Facility Development and Enhancement.

On 2007 November 06, Council approved in principle Mayor Bronconnier's Motion Arising, Coordinating Growth of Recreation and Sports Infrastructure, directing the investment of up to \$301.5 million to Program 507- Other Recreation Facilities and Program 51 - Additional CPRIP funding including \$40 million (\$10 million per quadrant) to be invested in City sport facility renewal (Program 507, Project 632 Recreation - Upgrade / Retrofit) and directed Administration to prepare implementation reports on projects for Council's consideration, directed through the Standing Policy Committee on Community and Protective Services.
