**Re: Designation of the Calgary (Royal Canadian) Legion #1 as a Municipal Historic Resource**

The Calgary Heritage Authority (CHA), in accordance with its role to advise Council and Administration on heritage matters in the City of Calgary, would like to take this opportunity to support the designation of the Calgary (Royal Canadian) Legion #1 located in the Downtown Commercial Core as a Municipal Historic Resource.

The Calgary (Royal Canadian) Legion #1 is listed on the CHA *Inventory of Evaluated Historic Resources* as a City Wide Historic Resource.

The Calgary (Royal Canadian) Legion #1, built in 1922, is two-storey symmetrical building with red-brick facade trimmed with sandstone. It features a central double-arched entranceway, round-arch window surrounds, and the words "1914 GREAT WAR VETERANS CLUB 1919" and "CANADIAN LEGION" across its frieze and parapet. The building faces the busy 7 Avenue C-Train line in downtown Calgary.
