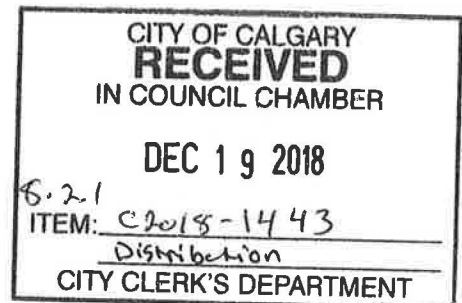
Janet Chafe

Janet Chafe is the Executive Director for Addiction and Mental Health with Alberta Health Services in Calgary. Janet has worked in health care for over 25 years, spending the majority of that time in the area of mental health. Janet has held a variety of positions including clinician, supervisor, manager and director, gaining extensive leadership and operational management experience, before taking on her current role.

As Executive Director for Addiction and Mental Health Janet is responsible for services across the continuum of care, including both outpatient and inpatient services located within multiple acute care and community sites; services for a variety of ages and specialties including child and adolescent, adult, geriatric, forensic mental health and addiction services; and oversight of contracted services provided by community agencies. Janet has held this position for just over four years. Janet has a master's degree in clinical social work from the University of Calgary, a diploma in addiction studies from McMaster University and is a clinical member of the American Association for Marriage and Family Therapy, Alberta Chapter.

Alberta Health Services

Alberta Health Services (AHS) is Canada's first and largest province-wide, fully integrated health system, responsible for delivering health services to more than 4.2 million people living in Alberta, as well as to some residents of Saskatchewan, British Columbia and the Northwest Territories. AHS has more than 109,000 employees, including over 101,000 direct AHS employees (excluding Covenant Health staff). AHS programs and services are offered at more than 650 facilities throughout the province, including hospitals, clinics, continuing care facilities, cancer centres, mental health facilities and community health sites. AHS also has community-based services designed to help Albertans maintain and/or improve their health status.

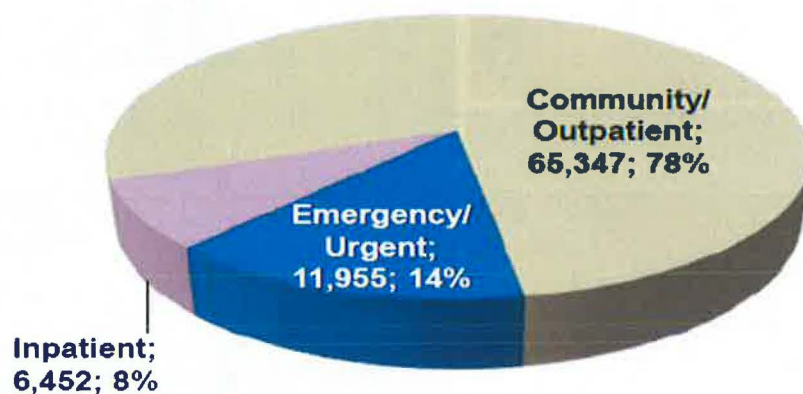

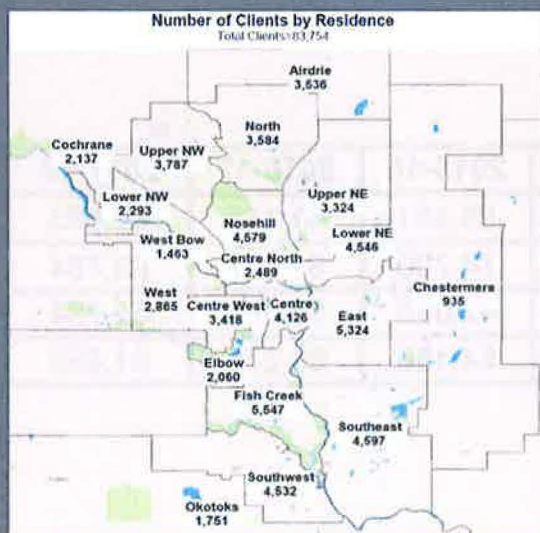

Number of Clients by Residence

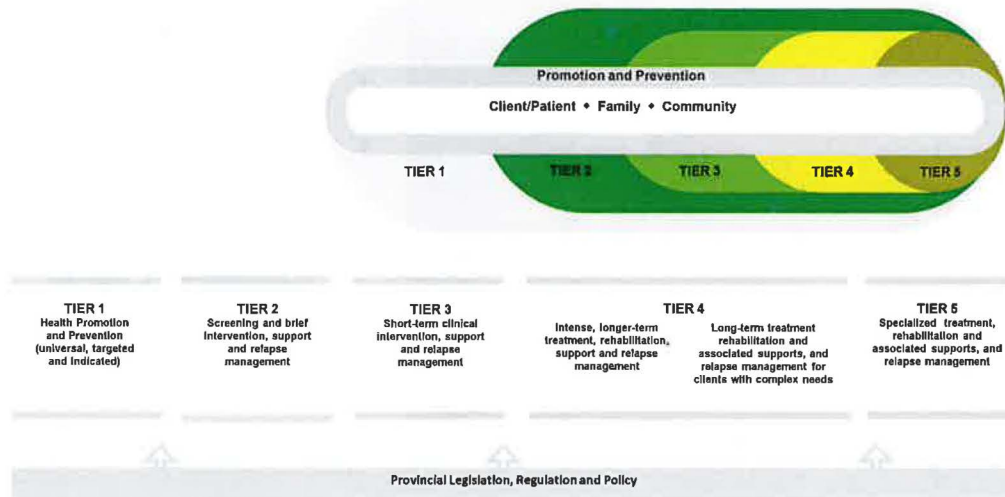

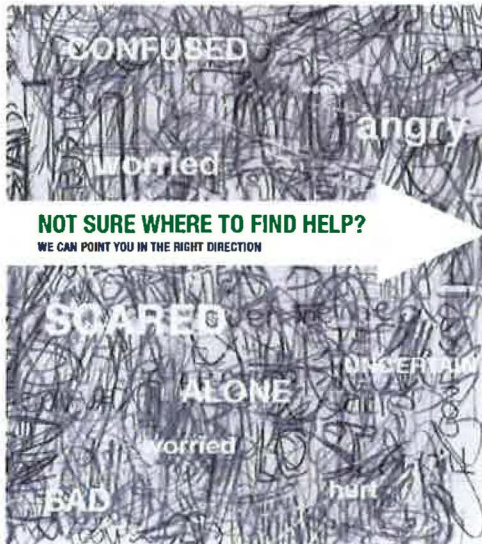
