On-site protective services in and around the SCS 24/7

Targeted enforcement to disrupt methamphetamine supply and distribution at Central Memorial Park - Daylight Initiative

Improve communication/relationships with stakeholders. On-going collaboration and continue building partnerships and enhance relationship at all levels

Corporate Security to collaborate with condo associations and business groups on security (already set up) in the area

Data sharing between partners to assist in informing decisions to create an accurate depiction of current social disorder issues and solutions

Targeted short-term police resourcing solutions near SCS

Request that the federal government contribute to the public safety related costs of its SCS policy, which describes public order as a key goal

Call on the federal government to convene a federal-provincial-municipal working group to address the complex jurisdictional overlap impeding the pursuit of shared objectives

NoM7: Resources to support the Beltline Neighbourhood Association, 4th Street Business Improvement Area and Victoria Park Business Improvement Area for community driven programming

Coordination function to support cross corporate team including SCS Community Liaison Team - develop good neighbour agreement, measures and better coordination of resources
