


Public Art Board

1. Meetings

As mandated in the Terms of Reference the Public Art Board meets monthly; the Board does not meet in August.

- 2017 the third Monday of the month, 10 meetings
- 2018 the third Monday of the month, 11 meetings
- 2019 the third Wednesday of each month, 2 meetings



2. Subcommittees

The Public Art Board does not have established subcommittees.

When work to be undertaken warrants specific skill sets or time commitments outside the parametres of scheduled meetings, the Board establishes ad hoc committees to research and compile information with information, recommended action items provided to the Board.



3. Initiatives

In consideration of our mandate to advocate for public art and as public members representing Calgary citizens on matters related to the Public Art Program we undertook a myriad of activities in the previous two years;

- Supported the ongoing review of the Public Art Program
 Attended Engage facilitated stakeholder conversations
 Met with external consultant charged with overview of the Program
 Facilitated meetings with artists, past Board members
- Met with the Indigenous Guiding Circle



4. Workplan

The Board will work with administration and the external consultant as the Public Art Program continues to develop and evolve in response to Notice of Motion 2017-32 and further direction from Council.

2019

- Participated in focus workshops with artists
- Review Board mandate and terms of reference, working with external consultant to provide recommendations to Council
- Undertake further conversations with the Indigenous Guiding Circle
- Increase opportunities to increase connect to communities and artists

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• Provide advisory overview to administration as Program evolves
