Proactive communications and events in 2015

- Updated <u>calgary.ca/trees</u> web page which resulted in a 174 per cent increase in visits compared to the previous year;
- Completed 12 blog posts, which had an average of 2,277 views per blog;
- Produced two Report to Calgarians videos that achieved over 235,000 views between them;
- Produced one animated video encouraging citizens to report tree concerns via the 3-1-1 app that received 54,120 views;
- Produced seven Global television segments for "Your Calgary Garden" that had an average viewership of 36,200 viewers;
- Conducted 28 media interviews plus a media scrum at the Snowtember anniversary event which generated approximately \$30,000 in free media advertising; and
- Held or attended 129 events/meetings where we spoke with nearly 10,000 Calgarians.
