

2014 Annual Report – Ensuring Safe Communities

Fire rescue: 21s faster than 2013 2014 90th percentile: 08:53

Life-threatening emergency medical: 11s faster than 2013 2014 90th percentile: 07:30

First full-alarm assignment at fire suppression events: 25s faster than 2013 2014 90th percentile: 14:13

Response times Per cent of first-in engine responses within 7 minutes total response time at fire rescue incidents.

Per cent of full first alarm assignment within 11 minutes total response time at fire suppression incidents.








