Timelines of Phases

Phase 1: Response (2014 September 9 to 2015 January 31) - Completed

- 2014 September 8 to 10 28.2 cm of snow (most in 130 years before fall equinox)
- 2014 September 11 100 traffic signals restored
- Several days 74,000 customers without power restored
- 2014 September 17 EOC closed
- 2014 October 17 Initial debris cleanup along streets and alleys in all communities completed
- 2015 January 31 Complete tree hazard assessment and high-risk mitigation

Phase 2: Recovery (2015 Q1 to 2018 Q4) - In progress

- Remove dead (beyond recovery) trees
- Improve tree health and survival rates (corrective pruning)
- Community engagement and education
- Build resiliency for future weather events

Phase 3: Restoration (2015 Q2 to 2018 Q4) - In progress

- Replant trees lost
- Add tree species diversity to limit impact of pests and diseases
