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## Recommendations

1. Approve **the terms of reference for the Community Action on Mental Health and Addiction Leaders Forum** to guide the development of the associated strategy and direct Administration to **develop a list of recommended members.**
2. Forward this report to the 2019 July 29 Combined Meeting of Council with a supplemental attachment including the names of proposed members of the Community Action on Mental Health and Addiction Leaders Forum as per the above recommendation.
3. Direct that Administration report back no later than **Q4 2020 with a Community Action on Mental Health and Addiction Strategy and collaborative implementation plan** guided by the strategic framework.
4. Approve the **terms of reference for the Mental Health and Addiction Collaborative Investors Table.**
5. **Authorize Administration to allocate \$1 million of the previously earmarked funds to test promising initiatives** through a fast pilot process, to be developed in collaboration with other potential funding partners who will form part of the Mental Health and Addiction Collaborative Investors Table.
6. **Authorize Administration to allocate up to \$3 million of the previously earmarked funds for 2020, to maintain current programs** funded through the Prevention Investment Framework with Mental Health and Addiction Lens that are demonstrating positive results.

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
